They said I have to go and apply in Pretoria because that's where the incident happened. That's why I'm late. And I didn't have money for transport at that time because the employer was not paying me my leave days.

JOE BROWN: Okay. Okay, that is the reason for the lateness. With regards to the case, are you claiming that the dismissal... Firstly, you resigned. Why did you resign?

JOHN SMITH: I resigned because I was not treated fairly.
